Each year, Rotary awards up to 100 fully funded fellowships for dedicated leaders from around the world to study at one of our peace centers.

Through academic training, practice, and global networking opportunities, the Rotary Peace Centers program develops the fellows into experienced and effective catalysts for peace. The fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and all internship and field-study expenses.

In just over a decade, the Rotary Peace Centers have trained more than 1,200 fellows. Many of them now serve as leaders at international organizations or have started their own foundations.

## **GRENADA HUMANITARIAN DENTAL MISSION AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS**

Dr. Brian Holmes of the Rotary Club of Florence Oregon just returned from his third humanitarian service trip to Grenada, an island country off the northern coast of Venezuela. He and his wife, Tammy, and their group of volunteers have been serving elementary schools in this developing nation, with the help of Grenadian native and former Florence resident, Otis Wade, and his wife Amy. Last July, Florence building contractor Brian Lacouture joined Dr. Holmes in Grenada

to rebuild some bathrooms in the Bonaire Government School in the town of Victoria. The facilities were broken and there was a common entrance to the boys and girls bathrooms, making them uncomfortable and frustrating for the kids to use, which led to some kids going home to use the bathroom and then not returning to school. With the help of local Grenadian handymen and the school principal, Mr. Francis, the Brians were able to completely renovate the bathrooms in just one week
