## **LAST CALL FOR DISTRICT RESOLUTIONS DUE MARCH 19**

Earlier in the year, a First Call for Resolutions to be considered during the business meeting of the 2018-19 District Conference beginning May 3, 2019, in Coos Bay, Oregon was published in the District e-news. The notice

provided that:

◆ Any resolution to come before the District at the District Conference must be distributed to all member clubs of the District by the District Resolution Committee at least one month prior to the District Conference. In order to disseminate any resolutions as required, the resolution committee must receive the proposed resolutions at least 60 days prior to the District Conference so the resolution can be reviewed by the committee to ensure it complies with the Constitution and By-laws of Rotary International and District policies. ◆

No resolutions have been submitted as of this time. In order for

any resolution to be considered under Article II **2(b)** of the District 5110 Policy Manual, the resolution **must be submitted to the District Governor before March 19, 2019.** Any submitted resolution will be distributed to the District Resolutions Committee by March 24, 2019. By April 2, 2019, any submitted resolutions will be disseminated to club presidents, past district governors, and members of the DG team.
