

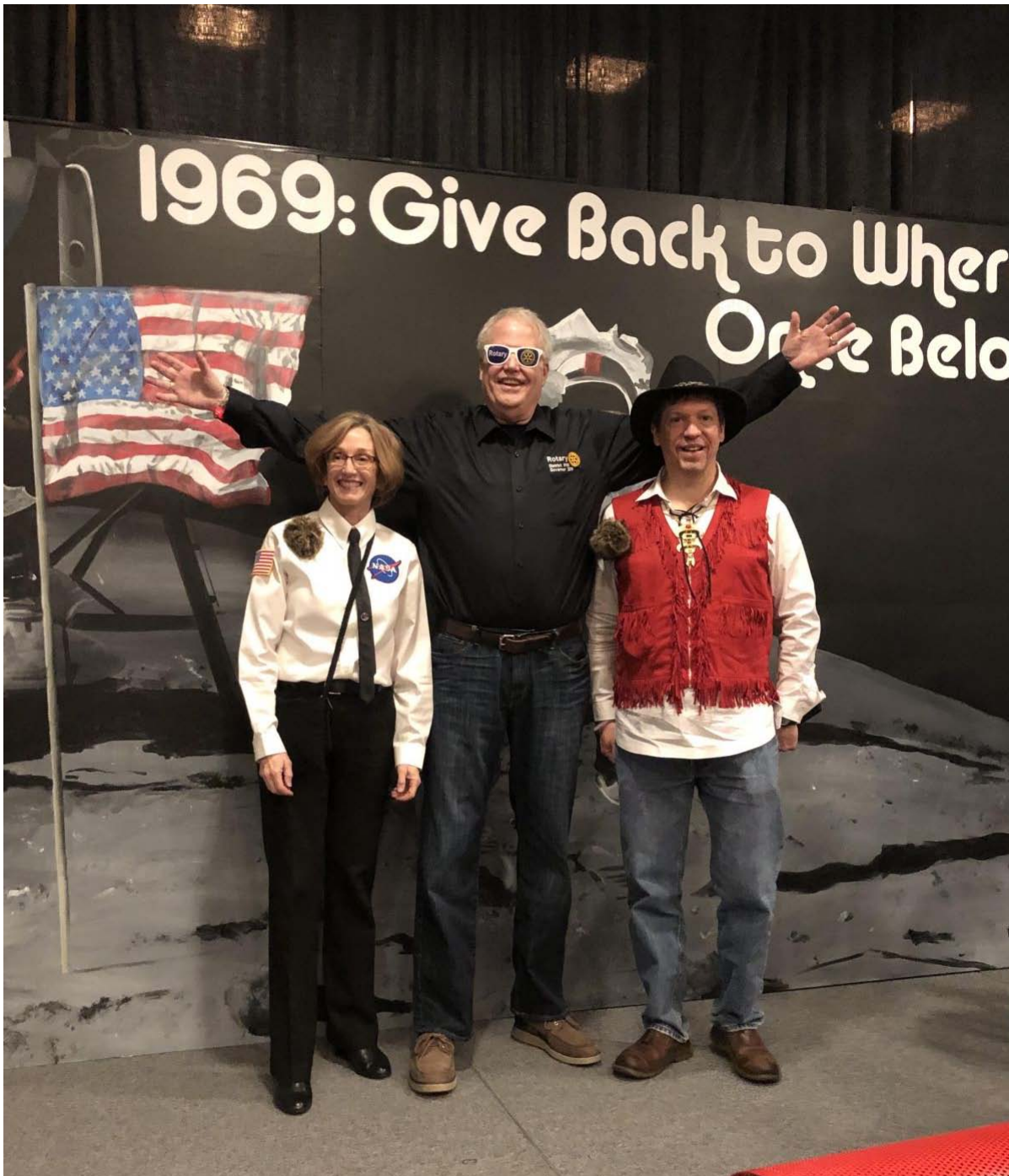

## **DISTRICT RESOLUTIONS DUE MARCH 19**

In order for any resolution to be considered it must be submitted to the District Governor before March 19, 2019.

Any resolution to come before the District at the District Conference must be distributed to all member clubs of the District by the District Resolution Committee at least one month prior to the District Conference. In order to disseminate any resolutions as required, the resolution committee must receive the proposed resolutions at least 60 days prior to the District Conference so the resolution can be reviewed by the committee to ensure it complies with the Constitution and By-laws of Rotary International and District policies.
