Keynote Speaker Paul K. Chappell

Paul K. Chappell is an international peace educator and serves as the Peace Literacy Director of the Nuclear Age Peace Foundation. He graduated from West Point, was deployed to Iraq, and left active duty as a Captain. Realizing that humanity is facing new challenges that require us to become as well-trained in waging peace as soldiers are in waging war, Chappell created Peace Literacy to help students and adults from all backgrounds work toward their full potential and a more peaceful world.



Peace Literacy frames peace not merely as a goal, but as a practical skill-set that allows us to increase realistic peace in our lives, communities, nations, and the world. Peace Literacy also helps us fully develop our human capacity for empathy, conscience, reason, and realistic hope.

Chappell is the author of the seven-book Road to Peace series about ending war, waging peace, the art of living, and our shared humanity. The first six published books in this series are Will War Ever End?, The End of War, Peaceful Revolution, The Art of Waging Peace, The Cosmic Ocean, and Soldiers of Peace.

TRANSFORMATIVE POWER OF ROTARY INTERNATIONAL IN PERU



Here is a message I received from Rotarian Jessica Linan Palomino in Lima, Peru expounding on the wonderful impact of Rotary Global Grants. I met Jessica on a Friendship Exchange several years ago. Delta Rotary and Southtown Rotary in Eugene, Oregon

have both been involved with her club on a previous grant for an orphanage.

District 5110 is making a difference.

I did not write in English so frequent, but I am really touched by this experience.

Since October 2017, Karen Greenberg and I started a hard work, as many of my Rotarian Friends said; but it was not like that. It was a learning and training, a way to know excellent people and sharing great moments with them. These are my words to define this experience.

We were a great team. Obviously, there were hard times, but, when, Mark said "let's rock and roll", we laughed, and the grants became approved.

Nowadays, after 18 months, Peru received 9 global grant for our poor communities/hospitals: incubators (Maternidad de Lima), TBC equipment (Red de Salud Lima Este Hospital Hipolito Unanue), dental chairs for Pachacamac Health Center, water for Manchaybamba, community development in AH La Capilla, education help for disable children at La Molina, mobile dental office for children in Callao, 60 standard wheelchairs and 11 neurological ones, toys and material for burned children, dental office in Barranca, malnutrition in Chimbote, assistance in Iquitos, etc.
