It's 7:00pm in Israel and our Oregon quartet is less than a week away from returning home. I've got a running mental list of things I have been impacted by over the past 11 days in this very unique country, with *language* and *technology* both landing in the top three of that list. For example, did you know please and

you're welcome are the same Hebrew word? I find that so fascinating. Did you know Google and Intel both have an R&D facility in Haifa? In this young, 71 year-old country, we should all be very impressed.

Learning some basic Hebrew, which is the language spoken by

everyone we have met in multiple cities, has endeared our hosts to us and helped form some lasting bonds. The more Hebrew we learn from one Rotary club, the more we use with the next. We see the surprise and appreciation in their expressions, which has made a great first impression. Just today, I was sitting next to one of our hosts in Be'er Yaakov (a small town near Tel Aviv). She does not speak English. We were looking at pictures on my iPhone when she suddenly looks at me and says, "Selfie." It does not matter that we don't speak each other's language.
