The Mill's conveniently adjacent waterfront RV Park makes conference attendance even more affordable for those choosing to bring their RV. A letter of intent from The Mill is holding the May 3-5, 2019 date for the CB-NB Rotary Club, but it is limited if DisCon 2019 is to avoid Mother's Day, which has been a scheduling conflict for our two most recent conferences.

DGN Bill favors holding DisCon 2019 on May 3-5 in Coos Bay at The Mill and is hopeful a pair of tall sailing ships can be arranged to visit Coos Bay during the conference. Supplementing this wonderful family experience, the Coquille Indian Tribe is proposing a traditional salmon bake and cultural demonstration at The Mill's outdoor salmon pit.

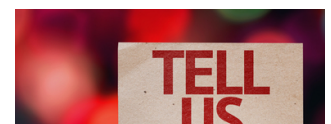

Grant Model Evaluation Results

Last year marked a Rotary milestone! We conducted our first triennial evaluation of the grant model to determine whether the Foundation's programs are meeting the goals set out in the Future Vision Plan. The evaluation was comprehensive and included:

- 109 project site visits by 63 Cadre members and outside consultants
- 6,000 responses to 6 surveys from 154 countries
- focus groups at 11 institutes

- feedback from the Future Vision Oversight Committee

We studied sustainability, the areas of focus, and vocational training team 24 countries around the world.

A little over a year ago, Camille Ronzio led a Rotary Friendship Exchange team to Romania and Moldova (Rotary District 22). This team included Susie Hanner, and Stevens as well as spouses Jim Ronzi and Marilyn Stever from Eugene Southtowne; Amar Ferguson, Davis Sr and Tyson Woodard from Cottage Grove; Emily and Rick Francona (E-Club of the State of Jefferson) from Port Orford and Dr. Arkell, Rotary Club of Bend Mt Bachelor and wife Laurie Power.

There were 12 team

members district wide. Camille worked with Alexandru Iote to organize the exchange. Alexandru is president of his club in Alexandria, Romania.

Alexandru and Rotarian Dr. Dumitru Mandoni saw horrible conditions causing infections and loss of life of infants and mothers in the Emergency Medical Hospital in Alexandria. While Alexandru was president of his club, he wanted to improve these conditions by improving access to quality medical services for women, pregnant or not. He wanted to reduce the mortality and morbidity by discovering fetal health issues before birth, increasing their health and sur

The hospital will take the lead for the installation and the maintenance of medical equipment. Eugene Southtowne (\$1500) and Rotary Club of Ben Bachelor (\$1000) were a part of this 4 country grant. Here is one great example of our Rotary dollars and our Rotary Friendships at work! We shall be proud to be a part of this First global grant project directly traced to Rotary Friendship Exchange! While visiting Peru on a Friendship Exchange in March 2016 the group visited several projects in the Lima area. One project really hit us hard, Hogar de Los Bienaventuranzas.

Father Omar Sanchez is a Catholic priest who has devoted his life into helping

these severely handicapped children. He maintains two homes in the Salvadore area of Lima, Peru. One for young children, boys and girls, and the other in a recently donated private school which is used for older boys. They are serving over one hundred and twenty children in the Salvadore homes. His group has also opened a home in Cusco, Peru, gateway city to Macchu Pichu. Twenty-five children currently live there.

These children have been either abandoned by their families or

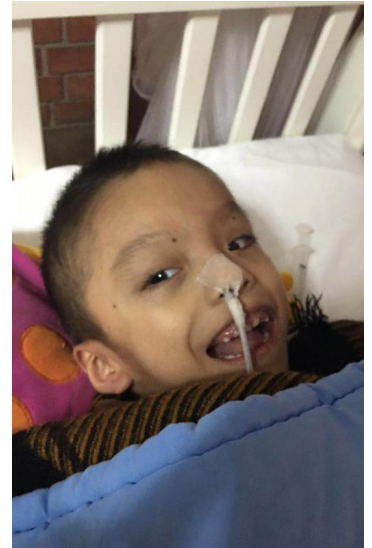
family just cannot afford the care that these kids need. There are social services in Peru to help out.

This home needs an industrial size washing machine to keep up with laundry, clothes and bed linen. They currently use two household machines that are on their last legs.

We are asking any clubs or club members to help us raise \$12,000 dollars to either buy one large industrial sized washer or two smaller units at \$6,000 apiece. Any amount would be welcome.
