District Grants

Greetings! I hope that all of you are doing well, and have been planning for submitting your great projects for proposed District Grants for 2017-18. I wanted to review some of the changes that have been proposed for next year's process in the hopes of making it work better and more fairly for all of our participating clubs. I will also include the timelines for District Grants for next year. (Please note that proposed changes will not be official until they are approved at the District Conference on May 21.)

1. All District Grant proposals are due to be completed in DACdb by June 1. This is a hard deadline, and no proposals will be considered if they are not submitted by that date.

2. Each club can submit up to two distinct grants proposals. You must indicate the priority of each grant. Your first priority grant should be listed as "high priority" on the grant details page. Your second grant should be listed as "medium priority" on the details page. We will consider all high priority grants for funding first. It is anticipated that there will be sufficient District Designated Funds (DDF) to support all first priority grants. In the unlikely event that we run out of DDF for high priority grants, we will randomly select clubs until the necessary reduction has been made. Clubs that voluntarily pulled a grant or reduced requested DDF to help us meet the shortfall in DDF last year will be guaranteed funding for their high priority grants this year.

After all high priority grants have been funded, all medium priority grants will be prioritized by a random drawing. These grants will be funded in that order until the DDF is exhausted.

3. Multiple club grants. If your club is participating in a multiple club grant, all of the clubs must indicate the same priority for the project. For example, each club must agree that the multiple club grant is either their high priority grant or medium priority grant for that year. If clubs are submitting an additional grant that only involves their club, then its priority must agree with what was submitted on the multiple club grant. Each club can only have one high priority grant.

4. Please remember that the first step in a district grant is completing the proposal. Once that proposal is approved, it will be included in the District's spending plan, and submitted to TRF for approval in July. Once our spending plan is approved, you will be given the go ahead to complete the entire application. **A completed proposal is not a completed grant application.** It is simply this first step in the process.

My goal is to help you to complete your district grant applications successfully! Please let me know if you need any assistance or if you have any questions.
