Rotary Dollars and Service to Benefit Youth for the Holidays

The Tulelake Rotary Club will be packing 100 (50lb potato boxes) food boxes prior to their club meeting this week. These boxes will be given to four area schools for staff to disperse to the students in greatest need the week prior to (50 boxes) Thanksgiving, and then again (50 boxes) the week prior to Christmas break from school.

The food box packing is a partnership with Bloom which provides the items to put in the boxes and disperses the boxes, a donation of boxes from Cal-Ore Potatoes, and a \$500 action grant to help cover part of the cost of the boxes. The boxes have roughly \$50 in food value per box. The remaining costs are covered through other grants received through Bloom.
