GSE has been one of our most popular district activities primarily because our inbound exchange teams travel around and visit clubs. We belong to Rotary International and most of our members enjoy getting to know our international guest. Even though the TRF trustees

have changed the program, our district, thus far, has been able to find resources to continue with these exchanges.

Dell and Jill along with their committee work hard throughout much of the year. As soon as the District Governor identifies his or her plan for the year, they coordinate with our partnering district, advertise and select team member, help orient the team and stay in contact with them. They also plan and coordinate the inbound teams activities with individual clubs.

Currently they are **Seeking Group Study Exchange TEAM LEADER** to for our GSE trip to **Argentina – April 18th – May 22nd, 2017**. Application deadline is **November 18th, 2016**. **Recent changes approved by The Foundation trustees allow us to continue to sponsor GSE teams if we fund them ourselves and allow us to use grant money for Vocational Training Teams. VTT's must relate to one of our 6 areas of focus and may be made up of all Rotarians or in some situations no Rotarians.**
