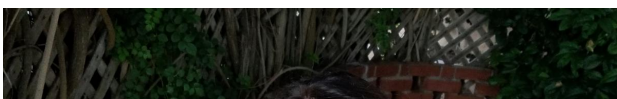

in a different part of the region. Rotaractors across District 5100 and 5110 have been looking forward to having the conference in our neck of the woods for months!

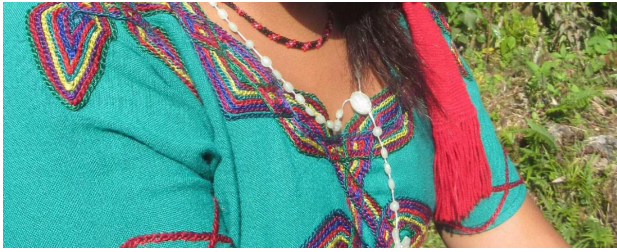

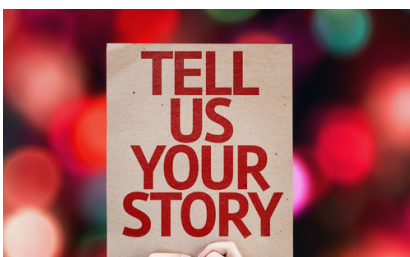
