#### RULES:

1. Contest is open to anyone wishing to BAKE TWO (2) Apple Pies, remaining cut pie, and whole pies will be sold at the Port Orford Rotary Club's Annual Oktoberfest immediately following the contest. Funds received from the sale of the pies will benefit Rotary projects such as Community Service Projects & Scholarships
2. Each entrant will bake 2 (two) double crust apple pies in a 9" aluminum, disposable/recyclable pie tin. \*\*No Crumbles, Crisps, Betty's or Pan Dowdy's Allowed: just traditional double crust pies
3. No other fruits may be included in the pie (juice ok)
4. Please, NO UNCOOKED EGG allowed in pies. They must be able to be held at room temperature. Pies requiring special handling like refrigeration will not be accepted.
5. Pie will be entered by 8:00 PM at the American Legion Hall on Saturday, October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2016. Late pies may be donated, but will not be judged.
6. Scoring: Both pies will be judged on their visual appeal, and will be given a score 1-10 points.
7. One pie will be cut and tasted for Crust 1-10 points, Filling 1-10 points, Overall taste 1-10 points
8. Points for appeal will be added to crust, filling, and taste for an overall high score of 40 points.
9. All judging is final!
10. Prizes for First, Second and Third place pies will be announced and awarded at the Oktoberfest, with First, Second and Third place whole pies live auctioned at the Oktoberfest at 7:00 PM
