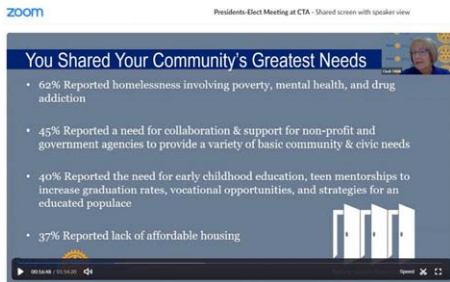

On May 27, a new building arrived at Hope Village, in Medford, Oregon. The building was actually two tiny houses joined in one structure. The \$20,000 needed to purchase it was raised by donations from members of the Medford Rogue Rotary Club.

Hope Village is operated by Rogue Retreat, whose mission is to address the growing homeless epidemic in Southern Oregon by providing housing and relationship-based case management that helps participants overcome the barriers that keep them from obtaining housing and becoming self-sufficient.
