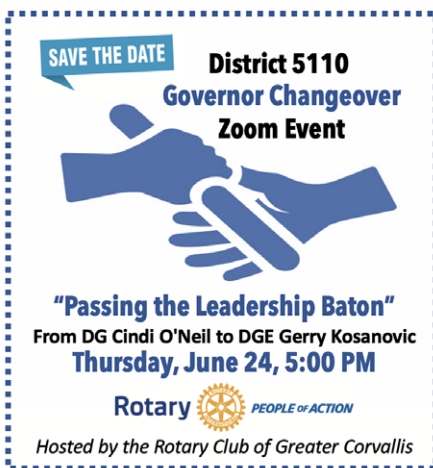

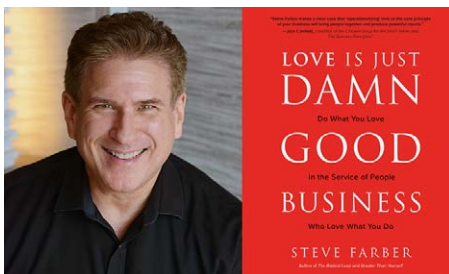

## District Grant Submittal Process Has Been Reopened

Applications for funding club district grant projects for 21-22 year did not exhaust funds available, so **we are reopening applications until July 2<sup>nd</sup> midnight**. If you need support, please let me know. Below you will find the **rules of engagement** for the 2nd round. There is remaining DDF for a maximum of 8 projects at the \$2000 level for DDF (More projects if less than \$2000 is requested per project).

1. District Grant Application submissions will reopen until July 2nd midnight.
2. Any club that has not submitted up to two grants can submit a grant application in this round,
3. No multi-club grant requests will be accepted.
4. Lottery will determine grant awards if more than \$16,000 in DDF is requested.

NOTE: All clubs who previously submitted 1 or 2 grants by the June 1st deadline will be funded, if approved, and are not affected by this round for new applications.
