LEAP stands for Lunger Educational Assistance Program.

The school has been supported by Rotary Grants, which supplied the school with desks, chairs, and supplies. It is for the "deeply disadvantaged children."

It is to teach these children that they can RISE ABOVE the poverty and learn and have opportunities that others have with education. It not only teaches the children, but also it is a social transformation.

The schools are located in townships where the poverty is extreme and they interview the kids who are interested in being educated. Parents also have to make a commitment to allow the children to attend. The goal is to achieve financial sustainability.

There is a new computer lab, science lab and life orientation area. This gives so much pride amongst the students.
