Berkeley Rotary has been improving education on the west coast of Mexico since 2003. Working in partnership with the La Penita Rotary Club, we will be adding a new classroom to the one-room school in Los Ayala, a small, coastal community in the state of Nayarit and 60 miles north of Puerto Vallarta. Their kindergarten has grown from 12 students to 34 in the past year and another classroom is needed. The parents, many with construction experience, will be working with us on the project.

A Bit of History. In 2003, Berkeley Rotary began a series of hands-on projects in the Chacala area that supported renovations and enhancements of educational facilities. In an effort to have a regional impact on improving

Behind the Scenes at BAMPFA

The Berkeley Art Museum and Pacific Film Archive (BAMPFA) is a unique gem that sits at the interface of UC Berkeley, the local fine-arts community, and the public. Who among us would not want to be a member after listening to the enthusiastic and well-



informed AJ Fox, Media Relations Manager, at our Jan. 11, 2023, meeting. He spoke with knowledge gleaned from a lifelong passion for film and an interest in fine arts, communicating his message with skill and informal polish, likely gleaned from a previous career in public relations.

The Berkeley Art Museum was formed in 1970 to exhibit a substantial collection of art that UC Berkeley had acquired throughout the years, making the works available for broader public view. Founding museum director Peter Sells soon welcomed an offer from film collector Sheldon Renan to receive his substantial collection of old films. This transformed the museum from an institution displaying significant and varied fine art to one that took on the function of archiving and showing a vast collection of domestic and foreign films. Sheldon Renan was the founding film curator at the Pacific Film Archive.
