

Our speaker last Wednesday was Nancy Ng, Executive Director of Creativity & Policy at Luna Dance Institute. Her colleague at Luna, John Mario Aracilla Sevilla, introduced her, citing her many roles as director, facilitating professional development workshops and mentoring and coaching teaching artists, teachers, and social service workers. She is a co-founder of MPACT (Moving Parents and Children Together), Luna's nationally recognized program for families in choreographer with San Francisco's Asian American Dance Performances, where she directed presentation and education programs and choreographed her own works, which

delved into Asian female stereotypes, immigration, and racism. As an arts education leader, Ng was the president of the California Dance Education Association and a committee member of the National Dance Education Organization's Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion initiative. Read More
