Berkeley Rotary has supported the Guatemalan Hospital de la Familia in various ways since Richard Erickson's presidency in 1992 when we donated an ophthalmic operating microscope and an X-ray machine. In the last 10 years, the volume of surgery in the eye clinic has increased from 500 to 2,500 per year as a result of expanding the eye department and hiring Guatemalan ophthalmologists


