Last week Dr. Andy Sorensen, brother of Berkeley Rotarian Bob Sorensen, provided an informative, inspiring, and optimistic view of the progress of eye care in Guatemala. Drs. Sorensen are both ophthalmologists, as was their father and is currently another brother and

a daughter (Bob's). It appears that ophthalmology is the family business. Likewise, the dedication to providing eye care to everyone, especially the poor in Guatemala, runs deep in the Sorensen family. Their interest in Guatemala began in 1978 when Bob and Andy's father took the family on a trip to the country (in the middle of a civil war). Since 1987, Bob and Andy have returned to Guatemala several times, donating their time and expertise at the Hospital de la Familia in Nuevo Progreso, San Marcus. # **Board Bullets**

Here's a brief look at some of the actions taken by the Club and Endowment Boards at their meetings last Wednesday, March 15. Please contact Joan Collignon if you would like to see the actual minutes.

#### **Berkeley Rotary Club**

- District 5160 has raised dues for the coming year, so we will have to raise our Berkeley Rotary Club dues to reflect that and our increased expenses since we last raised dues 3 years ago. In addition, Rotary International will be raising their annual dues. Note that BRC dues include RI dues, District dues, and the expenses necessary to run our club, like rent and insurance. The dues increase will take place for the year beginning July 1, 2023. The invoice for these dues will be sent to all members in May.
- Our Operating Account is running a monthly deficit despite our institution of the Zoom charge. We will be taking funds out of our reserve savings to cover this.
- A subcommittee is meeting on March 20 with the goal of coming up with a strategy and recommendations for raising additional Club funds, which they will present at the Board meeting of April 19.
- In light of the current State and City guidelines for gatherings during COVID, the Board voted to change the wording on our website and email communications to:

Masking is encouraged but not required. However, if you are not feeling well, have traveled recently, or believe you may have been exposed to COVID-19, then join us on Zoom.

### **Berkeley Rotary Endowment**

- Grier Graff presented the recommendations of the Grants Committee for the March grant cycle. Six grants totaling \$13,500 were approved, leaving \$6,500 in the Grants budget for the May cycle. Once the applicants have been notified of the status of their grant proposal, members will see a report on which grants were funded.
- The Mexico Project will move forward, with a small planning team traveling to Nayarit in June to evaluate possible hands-on projects.
