its spring PolioPlus fundraising drive this week. Last year, at this time, the District launched its PolioPlus Warrior campaign, asking Rotarians to pledge \$100 each year to PolioPlus. Our club led the District clubs in our donations. If you gave \$100 for the current fiscal year in the fall campaign, we'll welcome more donations but won't bug you. If you didn't give last year--you were not yet in the club, or out of town, or fully isolated from the world with Covid--this is a chance to be part of the final drive to eliminate polio. Note: The Gates Foundation is still doing its 2:1 match this year, so each dollar you donate yields \$3 for the international effort.

If you gave last spring, but not yet this year, note that there is a PolioPlus document signed by our club's own Cliff Dochterman and by Dr. Jonas Salk, that will be given by lottery to a Paul Harris Warrior who donated \$100 both last year and this year. It's reported to have been appraised at \$3000+. Cliff donated it before he died. So make sure you give again this year, if you gave last year. Read More

The Berkeley High Robotics Club provided an informative and entertaining presentation at our meeting on April 13, including a demonstration of their current award-winning robot, Squid. Five students gave the presentation, led by James Underwood and Nicola Simon. We were also delighted to have Madelyn Philhower, a reporter for the *Jacket*, the Berkeley High newspaper, come to report on the event.

The Robotics Club is made up of volunteers, although the school has robotics classes, and the instructor is the advisor for the club. Currently, the club has about 40 active members, with an annual budget of \$40,000. (Berkeley Rotary is one of their sponsors.)
