New incentives keep coming in for this spring's PolioPlus campaign. First, the Gates Foundation offered a match of two dollars for each dollar you donate. In the last two weeks, we learned of a lottery for all donating at least \$100 last year and this year as PolioPlus Warriors to get a document signed by Dr. Jonas Salk and Cliff Dochterman, valued, the District says, at \$3000. Today, I received word that the head of the Rotary International Foundation, former RI President John Germ, has promised to phone his thanks personally to each donor giving \$1000 or more. At its April 20 meeting, the Berkeley Rotary Club was treated to an inspirational and informative presentation by Natalia Neira Retamal, Executive Director of La Peña Cultural Center. Located at 3105 Shattuck Avenue, La Peña has a long and rich history as a nonprofit cultural center serving the Latin American and Caribbean diasporan communities with a



platform for cultural exchange, celebration, and education. Founded in 1975, La Peña is one of the oldest, continuously operating such organizations in the country. Its formation was in direct response to the horrors of the 1973 military coup in Chile and was inspired by the *peñas* of Chile which are community gatherings centered around music, food, drink, and culture.

Still going strong in its 46th year, La Peña offers a rich variety of cultural programming, including music, dance, food, and the arts in all its forms. Popular programs include community jams, live music, poetry slams, dance lessons, educational events, and immersive experiences. <u>Read More</u>
