James Brenneman, or Jim as he prefers to be called, has been president and professor of Hebrew Bible at Berkeley School of Theology since the Fall of 2017. Just prior to his call to BST, he completed nearly 12 years as president of Goshen College in Indiana. He previously served on the faculty at Episcopal Theological School at Claremont in Old Testament scholarship for 15 years and was founding/lead pastor of Pasadena Mennonite Church where he served for 20 years. He is an ordained Mennonite minister.

Jim has a BA degree in Natural Science/Biology from Goshen College in 1977, a MDiv degree from Fuller Theological Seminary in 1982, a MA in Religious Studies from Claremont Graduate University in 1991, and a PhD there in Hebrew



Bible/Ancient Near Eastern Studies in 1994. He is the author of **On Jordan's Stormy Banks: Lessons from the Book of Deuteronomy** published by Herald Press and **Canons in Conflict: Negotiating Texts in True and False Prophesy** published by Oxford University Press, and has written numerous book chapters, journal articles, and popular magazine articles on biblical, theological, science-religion, and other religious

## A Taste of the Scottish Fiddlers

WOW! What a treat! The Freight and Salvage Team arranged to have four members of the San Francisco Scottish Fiddlers provide us with a meeting full of lively music. They included our own Pate Thomson, Jeri Morrison, Dave Alan, and Judy Thomson on keyboard. To top it off, Pate provided us with an historic timeline on the importance of the fiddle in Scotland.

According to Pate, along with the bagpipe and the Celtic harp, the fiddle has a long history of prominence in Scotland, starting with a person-



to-person oral tradition in the 1600s, although the music wasn't written down until the 1800s. The fiddle provides harmony to many different types of melodies–reels, waltzes, marches, hornpipes, as well as lyrical tunes such as airs and laments. Giving us a taste of both a lament and then a lively reel, the foursome blended their fiddles and the piano to create a nostalgic, poignant melody that brought tears to many an eye. Then, as they broke into a reel, our feet started moving, bodies swayed, and some folks couldn't even help but jump up for a bit of dancing.

Pate, an internationally recognized cardiologist, had first become interested in fiddle music in his 50s after meeting with Alasdair Fraser. Fraser was responsible for the renaissance of the fiddle when he started the Valley of the Moon fiddle camp in 1987,

with 17 members. It now has over 306 members with 2 camps in California, one each on the Isle of Sky, in Spain, and in Australia.

The group finished up with an encore of André Brunet's Sweet Evening Rain and Promenade à Monaco as well as a reminder that, if we wanted to hear more of this vibrant music, the San Francisco Scottish Fiddlers will be playing at Freight & Salvage on Friday, May 19 –
