Parenting in the Digital Age

On May 26, Yalda Uhls, a psychologist, spoke to the club on Media Moms and Digital Dads, the name of her best-selling book.

Uhls grew up in Berkeley, attending UC Berkeley as an undergraduate and receiving a Masters and a PhD at UCLA in Developmental Psychology. She worked in the entertainment business for 15 years as a senior executive for MGM and Sony Pictures, producing several pictures, including *Mi Familia*, a multigenerational story of an immigrant family.

Returning to academia, Uhls founded The Center for Scholars and Storytellers (CSS), affiliated with UCLA.



The Center brings together researchers and storytellers to support young people and collaborates with more than 50 researchers from universities around the world, as well as leaders in the entertainment industry and media. Its research is published in newsletters, fact sheets, blogs, and reports and covered widely in the press. Two areas of focus currently are diversity and inclusion and mental health.
