

Mapping COVID from Outbreak to Vaccination: An International Perspective

At our last meeting, incoming club member Helena Meyer-Knapp provided the club with a cogent and thoughtJuly 5th <u>Mary Alice Rathbun</u> July 7th



provoking discussion of how different nations, particularly Japan, responded to the COVID pandemic. Helena, who is a faculty member emerita in Sociology from Evergreen State College in Washington, has used her experiences living in many countries to see a comparative world, which helps her to objectively examine the strengths and weaknesses of different cultures and forms of governance. She has used these insights to make peacemaking and conflict resolution her life swork, particularly with regards to the century-old antagonisms between Japan and both Koreas.

The purpose of Helena stalk was not to provide definitive answers as to why countries responded differently to the pandemic, but rather to highlight some of these different approaches and outcomes to give us

new insights into the countries themselves, as well as to the efficacy of their pandemic coping strategies. The pandemic raised so many questions, including: Did it set off a competition between nations? If so, which ones won? Was there a best way, or a better way? Was the U.S. response a disaster? And many more.
