# PolioPlus Success 2022/23

At the District awards banquet last week, Grier Graff was cited for his generous and consistent financial support of Rotary's PolioPlus work, Rotary's largest humanitarian effort each year. Give him your thanks.

We were both thanked and a bit chided for our club efforts this past year. We donated close to \$6000; with the Gates Foundation match, that means \$18,000 for PolioPlus. Some 25 members continued

their \$100 or more donations as part of their annual pledge to the District's PolioPlus Warriors drive, but that was a drop of half the prior club donors at that level. There are District clubs where all members donate as Warriors each year. Many more club members donated something to the campaign, of course, and any amount earns that match.

So how is the campaign doing?

- **Overall funding**. Funding in 2022-23 rose to \$175 million to End Polio from \$152 million the year prior. That's vaccinating children in the many millions.
- Wild polio cases, our historic focus. As of July 7, there were only 6 cases worldwide (5 in Afghanistan and 1 in Pakistan), compared to 13 last year.
- Vaccine-derived cases are decreasing, given the many millions of vaccinations each year as well as the new vaccines, but are increasingly a major focus of the campaign. To date, there have been 136 vaccine-derived cases this year, compared to 164 last year.

# **Bringing Clean, Renewable Energy to Conservation Projects Around the World**

JG Collomb and Stephen Gold of Wildlife Conservation Network (WCN) are working to bring clean, renewable energy to conservation projects around the world. They believe that clean energy is essential to protecting wildlife and wild places, and they are working to make it more accessible to conservation organizations. Dr. Jean-Gael "JG" is Chief Executive Officer and Steve Gold is Volunteer Solar and Sustainability Manager.

WCN's efforts focus on three main areas:

- (1) Providing technical assistance: WCN helps conservation organizations assess their energy needs and develop plans to switch to clean energy. They also provide technical assistance on the installation and maintenance of clean energy systems.
- (2) Funding: WCN provides grants to conservation organizations to help them cover the costs of switching to clean energy. They also work with donors to raise funds for clean energy projects.
- (3) Advocacy: WCN advocates for policies that support the use of clean energy in conservation. They work with governments and other organizations to promote the adoption of clean energy standards and regulations.
