

# The Opportunities and Challenges of Building a New Hotel in Downtown Berkeley

The speaker at the Club's meeting on August 11 was Ed McFarlan, architect. He is also a member of Oakland Rotary. In 2012, after much controversy, the City of Berkeley created a Downtown Area Plan to preserve the core downtown, modernize it, and add to it. Most controversal, the plan allowed for three more high-rise buildings of 180 feet each, and two more at 128 feet each. All other new buildings must be 60 feet or lower.

A developer, Jim Didion, decided that one of the high-rise sites at the corner of Center and Shattuck was the perfect spot for a hotel. The design and planning for the new downtown Berkeley Marriot Residence Inn started in 2011.
