Wednesday, August 31, 12:30 PM PT (in person at First Presbyterian and via Zoom): Neelam Patil, an inspirational science teacher at Cragmont and Oxford elementary schools, presents "Miyawaki Forests: Ecosystems in Public Schools." Neelam helped Berkeley become the first school district in the country to fund dense, biodiverse Miyawaki forests (<a href="https://bit.ly/3AHLcoz">https://bit.ly/3AHLcoz</a>). Last November, Berkeley elementary students planted over three thousand drought-tolerant native saplings that grow faster and require less water than normal trees. As a fifth grader said, "It eliminates a lot more carbon than a normal forest, it grows



faster than a normal forest, and it lets in more wildlife." The speaker is provided by Team #7, the Freight & Salvage Team; John Pardee and Michele Lawrence, Captains.
