Life in Light: The Glasswork of Theodore Ellison Designs

Stain glass artist Ted Ellison gave a captivating and inspiring talk to Berkeley Rotarians and their guests on Wednesday, August 25. Intertwining the historic influence of his designs with the aesthetic and structural elements, he took us through his journey as an artist as well as the creative process of his nationally known firm specializing in crafting exquisite custom mosaic and leaded glass.

Citing influences of architects such as Frank Lloyd Wright and the Greene brothers as well as designer Louis Comfort Tiffany, Ellison described how he carved out his own path by following his art and being honest and true to his passion. He has made a successful career that enhances the lives of those who encounter his artwork and helps people live out their passions as well.



Showing images of wisteria vines, Japanese maples, redwood branches, and lemons - designs that flowed over windows and doorways - he talked about the process of using multiple layers of glass to create tree trunks and soldering glass together with copper foil. He described the process of creating the soft matte surface of lemons, the iridescence of falling blossoms, and the rich depth of honed glass to evoke the look of ebony.
