# The Remains of Communism in the Post-Communist World

Last Wednesday, the club was treated to a class by Dr. George Breslauer, UC Berkeley Professor Emeritus of Russian History and Politics, on the topic "The Remains of Communism in the Post-Communist World."

Dr. Breslauer pointed out that there were 16 communist countries until around 1989, when they began to collapse in Eastern Europe. Today, there are only five that he would define as communist: North Korea, Laos, Vietnam, Cuba, and

China. His definition of a communist state is one that is "run by a single party that traces its origins to Marx and Lenin, that brooks no formal opposition, does not allow competing political parties, imposes censorship, and extends political controls throughout society through a combination of party and secret police controls, with assistance from the military when needed."
