

Single Payor Health Care in Contemporary America

Dr. Sapir presented a data filled talk advocating support for a Single Payer Health Care (House Resolution 1384). Or was it a critique of US health care? It was both. He based this position on facts about US health care and he countered the attacks against the Medicare for All proposal.

Most notable was the revelation that the US per capita spending is twice that of other affluent nations. The outcome, as measured by infant mortality, life expectancy and other parameters of population health, shows the US coming out a distant tenth among ten of the most affluent nations. It was clear that we are not getting a bang for the buck and there are enormous costs in the health care bureaucracy and systems. Read More
