
Picnic in the Park

Annual Peace Celebration at Rotary Peace Grove

The Rotary International Peace Grove in Berkeley's Tilden Park contains 100 redwood trees planted in 1955 when a missile base became an East Bay Park. Each year, the Berkeley Rotary Club dedicates a tree and bestows a plaque in honor of an individual or organization that has done work for the cause of international peace. This year the award was given to Greta Thunberg, the young Swedish climate change activist.

The annual celebration was held last Wednesday at the Grove, with about 30 attending in person and 18 by Zoom,



some from as far away as Scotland. Dan Thomas opened the program created by our Peace Committee, followed by a passionate talk about Greta Thunberg by Ed Church, urging us as Rotarians to commit to ending the human causes of climate change. The award plaque was presented, on behalf of Thunberg, to Rev. Dr. Ambrose Carroll, who heads an environmental justice organization called Green the Church. Rev. Carroll's speech moved all of those present. The ceremony ended with the recitation of the Litany, led by members of the Peace Committee and responded to by both those present and those on Zoom.
