

# A Vision for Berkeley's Civic Center

On October 12 Eleanor Hollander presented to Rotary the <u>Berkeley Civic Center Visioning Project</u>. Eleanor is Manager of the <u>Office of Economic Development</u> for the City of Berkeley, overseeing business services and arts programs for the city, and is also co-managing the Civic Center project with the Department of Public Works.

Eleanor talked about the Civic Center Vision Statement, adopted by



the City Council in September, to make the Civic Center the prime space for civic life, culture, and arts in the City of Berkeley and to seismically renovate the Maudelle Shirek Building (aka Old City Hall) and the Veterans Memorial Building, as well as renovate Civic

Center Park. Phase 1 of the project has already developed the concept of a "Berkeley Center" in the Maudelle Shirek Building, which would include the Berkeley Historical Society as well as Council Chambers in or adjoining the building. An Arts Hub/Center is planned for the Veteran's Memorial building to house a number of arts organizations with performance space in the theater and additional meeting, practice, and exhibition spaces.
