More than a year ago, ten Rotarians wearing hard hats and day-glo vests toured the vast construction site on Berkeley Way that was to become the Hope Center—a vision of the Berkeley Food and Housing Project that would provide six floors of apartments, shelter beds, and supportive services to unhoused people, linked to a Bridge Housing project of affordable apartments and services for low income and very low income individuals and families. Berkeley Rotary donated \$50,000 to the Hope Center.
