# **Berkeley Rotary Endowment Annual Report or How Your Donations Change the World**

Our very own Berkeley Endowment Treasurer, Tina Etcheverry, with the support of Endowment Secretary Grier Graff, presented the 2022/23 Endowment Report to the club on November 15. In her super-organized but relaxed way, Tina made the report on our endowment dollars and cents very engaging and emphasized all the wonderful things our club has been able to accomplish through our donations. She even added in some audience participation by testing our knowledge of endowment factoids, with special pens awarded to the winners.

The first question was to identify the two major fundraisers from last year which supplemented members' contributions. Astute Rotarians knew these were the Not-So-Silent Auction and the Taste of Downtown Berkeley. Our members contributed \$30,500; the Not-So-Silent Auction yielded \$24,900; and the Taste of Downtown Berkeley raised \$15,600, for a total of \$71,000 in unrestricted funds. In addition, there were \$128, 365 in designated gifts.

Anchored by our warehouse, our sourcing and distribution programs aim to get high-quality, healthy food to people in need. Thank you for joining us in our work to end hunger in our community! With your help, all of our friends and neighbors in need will be able to put high-quality, nutrient-dense food on their tables.
