to build a house in a day for a needy family in Tecate, Mexico! This year's project is coming up on May 18. Here are some important things to know about the project:

- Sign up at www.corazon.org, under either of the District 5300 projects listed.
- YOU MUST HAVE A PASSPORT TO PARTICIPATE IN THIS PROJECT. No passport, no crossing the border.
- No individual cars will be permitted. Volunteers will take buses from Chula Vista. The cost for the bus is \$30 and there will be plenty of space on the bus for coolers, food, supplies, and so on. This is a requirement of our partner, Project Corazon, and is mandatory.
- Hotel rooms have been set aside in Chula Vista at La Quinta Inns, 150 Bonita Road. Call 619-691-1211, ask for the Group Desk and tell them you are with Rotary International District 5300. They have reserved 20 king rooms at \$94.50 per night

and 30 double rooms for \$103.50 per night, for May 17 and 18. These rates are good while they last and until April 30 at the latest, so book your room early if you are planning to do.

- Bring your tools, your know-how, and your handy friends and family! And by all means wear your Rotarian At Work t-shirt! And if you don't have building skills, bring some rollers and brushes and be prepared to paint up a storm!
- Again, YOU MUST HAVE A VALID PASSPORT TO PARTICIPATE.

If you can't make it to Mexico, then by all means plan on coming out for our next Done in a Day project on April 27. We will be painting the garage at the Ronald McDonald House in Pasadena. Later, **Joshua** made the announcement that the <u>Mayor's Prayer Breakfast</u> will take place on May 9 at 7:30 am. The Keynote speaker is Dr. Thomas F. Rosenbaum, President of Caltech and Professor of Physics and he will be speaking on "Faith and Science". For the announcement, he gave \$20 to the Polio Pig.

President Mary Lou Byrne attended the Rotary Foundation District 5300 gala in Las Vegas, along with First Gentleman Gary Kearney and President Elect Scott Vandrick, and Community Grants Co-Chair Deborah Lewis. At the silent auction, President Mary Lou purchased a book entitled Century of Service: The Story of Rotary International. She presented it to President-Elect Scott who will take office for Pasadena Rotary's Centennial Year.

One of the Amazon reviews of *Century of Service* said: Book was very boring, and unfortunately contained no plot. Book would be best if it had more fight scenes, or action.

Be forewarned, Scott. No fight scenes.

First Gentleman Gary Kearney announced the next Corazon project would be on May 18. Drive down on Friday the 17th to a couple of hotels in Chula Vista where there is a block of rooms for \$103 each. Cross the border in a bus with other Corazon volunteers. You get to the site at 9 am and then build an entire house by 4 pm. Really.

Corazon not only provides a home but teaches people to live in a community because many of the residents are migrants from Central America. In Mexico, school is free but you need to buy a uniform so Corazon also provides a uniform for the children.

Cory Brendel announced that the Done in a Day committee will be painting the garage at the Ronald McDonald House on April 27 at 9 am. We are only painting. Another community group will have the prep work done.

Past President Diana Peterson-More gave \$5 to the polio pig, \$1 for each Rotarian that purchased her book since her last donation.

Jess First gave a polio pig donation of \$20 to invite us to <u>The Legacy Luncheon</u> at the La Canada Country Club on April 18, supporting the YWCA of Glendale which provides services for domestic violence victims in Glendale and Pasadena. Contact Jess if you'd like to go. She may be able to host you.

Jeff Palmer gave a polio pig donation to announce the birth of his 3rd grandchild and to tell us that he recently failed a nuclear stress test, but they did an angiogram and put in a stent. He's great now!

Akila Gibbs introduced our speakers George Lewis and Judy Muller, both journalists. George has reported on stories such as the Vietnam War, the Iran hostage crisis (where he spent 66 days until they expelled foreign journalists), Tiananmen Square and the revolution in Romania. Judy covered stories such as Rodney King, LA earthquakes, OJ Simpson and environmental stories of the West.

George and Judy are Mac users who had trouble managing their power point on a PC. Fortunately, they didn't give up because there was great stuff in that power point. They included a video of Rudy Giuliani on Meet the Press uttering the infamous line "truth is not truth" and Kellyanne Conway coining the term "alternative facts." Then there was this take on why making everything "breaking news" does more harm than good.

Fake news is disinformation created to deceive you not news you disagree with. Factual errors don't mean fake news. The Chicago Tribune printed the headline Dewey Defeats Truman. The paper supported Dewey but the mistake was unintentional. The Tribune corrected the headline and took accountability.

Trust in the news is down 50% and only 14% of Republicans trust the news.

Fake news isn't new. In ancient Greece, there were rumormongers and corn merchants spread made up stories of shipwrecks to drive up prices. What is new is the ability to photoshop pictures and insert voices into videos of real people to make it seem like they've said something they hadn't.

What's also new is social media and the proliferation of fake news sites. There are two motivations: money or "click bait" - where everyone who reads the story sees the advertisements - and propaganda. Do you know that your brain gives you a burst of dopamine every time you hear something that confirms your bias and beliefs?

The basic approach to news is the SMELL test. Source, Motivation, Evidence, Logic and what's Left out. There's a saying in journalism - if your mother says she loves you, check it out.
