Jessica Hardin was born in Illinois and moved to South Carolina with her family when she was 12. After graduating high school, she attended Smith College in Massachusetts and received her B.A. cum Laude while simultaneously attending the National Theater Institute in Waterford, Conn., and the British American Drama Academy in London, England. She moved to New York City and studied acting under the auspices of world-renowned Meisner instructor William Esper.

She signed with Innovative Artists and worked professionally as a model, dancer, singer, and actress while working for Judith Lesley Management, Abrams Artists, and Adrienne Stern Casting. On a family vacation, she discovered the joys of a Los Angeles winter and

decided to move to LA. She worked with the Will Geer Theatricum Botanicum in Topanga and Boston Court in Pasadena, Judi Farkas Literary Management and The Filmtrix Agency. While acting with the Knightsbridge Theatre in Silverlake, she met her future husband, who lived in Pasadena. She moved to Pasadena with him where she founded the Seven Sisters of Pasadena, and had the brainchild of founding the Pasadena International Film Festival.



About the Pasadena International Film Festival

Founded in 2013 by Jessica Hardin and Marco Neves, industry veterans and Pasadena residents, the Pasadena International Film Festival is the only competitive film festival in Pasadena, California. PIFF aims to bring high-caliber, independent cinema to a city renowned for its love of culture and the arts. Films that have won at PIFF have gone on to win at the American Pavilion Showcase at the Cannes Film Festival. 2019 marks the 6th year of the Pasadena International Film Festival, presenting more than 130 films from 15 countries during its nine-day run at Pasadena's Laemmle Playhouse 7 theater. Q&As, panels, a Filmmakers Lounge, and a Great Gatsby-themed closing night award ceremony were also planned.

President Mary Lou Byrne and First Gentleman Gary Kearney gave a report of What They Did Last Weekend. They spent the weekend in the San Bernardino Mountains with 400 (yes, 400) high school juniors at the annual RYLA weekend. RYLA stands for Rotary Youth Leadership Awards. President Mary Lou showed a video, much of which showed large groups of teenagers chanting. She told us that they did that most of the weekend. They also heard inspirational speakers and packed food boxes for people experiencing food insecurity.

Afterwards, Gary asked him what it would take for him to do it. The young man responded that he'd do it for \$20. Gary gave him \$20 and he did it.

Past President Frank Nicholas took on the Polio Pig for the vacationing Scott Carlson. Frank gave \$100 to the pig to honor Mary Lou and Gary for their RYLA participation and the Sunday Suppers. Mary Lou was so touched that she snorted into her open mic! Desiree Alvarado said that her son was one of the RYLA attendees. He was reluctant to go but loved the entire experience. Leah Snell's best girlfriend was an adult leader at RYLA. She loved it but, when she returned home, she had to take a 12 hour "nap."

Past President Howard Raff donated in honor of the 37th anniversary of his entrance into Rotary.

Past President Howard then discussed membership. So far this year, we have 18 new members. However, we have lost 18 members. **President Mary Lou** wants a net gain in membership. There are a carrot and a stick. You get a free lunch on the day of induction for each new member you bring. After the many fun announcements, **Marilyn Buchanan** introduced our speaker, Steve Mulheim, who was there to speak about Summer Fun in Old Pasadena. Steve serves as the President and CEO of the Old Pasadena Management District (OPMD), a non-profit organization that oversees a Property-based Business Improvement District (PBID) spanning

22 blocks in downtown Pasadena, California.

April 27-28th is the <u>Jackalope Indie Artisan Fair</u>, featuring artisan crafts, food and drink for sale and craft workshops. On August 3rd and 4th, the event returns in the evening as <u>Jackalope Summer Nights</u>.

On June 8, the entire city comes together to create art installations in the city's alleyways during <u>BoldPas: A Day of Art & Play</u>. After reviewing 70 submissions, 16 have been chosen and adults and kids will participate in putting them together. The installations will only be there for one day so even if you don't want to get in on the action, attend to see the exhibits.

As an added bonus, there will be a free shuttle to Pasadena Playhouse's <u>Block Party</u>, which we heard about when Danny Feldman, Producing Artistic Director of the Playhouse, spoke to us on January 29.

<u>Summer Cinema</u> runs from July 5th through July 28th with films and pre-screening events at One Colorado, Central Park and the Armory Center for the Arts.

An incredibly popular event is Get Yappy in the Park, which is Happy Hour with your dog. Each year, they make bandanas for the dogs. The first year, they made 150 bandanas and ran out. There were 3-400 dogs there. The next year, they made 300 bandanas. Again, they ran out because 6-700 dogs attended. Last year, they made 700 bandanas and *almost* ran out. The Humane Society co-sponsors the event and has activities such as an agility course. This year's event takes place on August 24.

Moving into fall, Old Pasadena has a Halloween event in which businesses give out candy to trick-or-treaters on October 31 and then the <u>Day of the Dead Weekend</u>.

Past President Dave Mans, Phil Hawkey, and David Minasian all asked questions. President Mary Lou told us to Go Out There and Be the Inspiration.
