## Rotaract 🛞

#### Rotary International Elevates Rotaract Status

Rotaract's elevated status within the Organization was approved by Rotary's Council on Legislation in June 2019 as part of an ongoing effort to make Rotary more appealing and welcoming to young professionals. In October, the RI Board of Directors approved several changes to Rotaract — the most notable being the removal of Rotaract's upper age limit.

As of 1 July, members of Rotaract will no longer be required to leave their club when they turn 31. Other notable changes include:

- Rotaract is now a type of Rotary membership.
- Rotaract clubs will be allowed to sponsor other Rotaract clubs or establish themselves without a sponsor.
- Rotaract will be open to all young adults 18 and over. There will no longer be an upper age limit of 30.
- The Trustees encourage Rotaract clubs to work with Rotary clubs on global grant projects.

- Rotaractors are now eligible to serve on district-level and RI committees.
- Rotaractors will enjoy greater support, training, and access to tools from Rotary.
- In 2022, Rotaractors will pay annual per capita dues of either \$5 or \$8.

This was followed by Sergeant-at-Arms Jason Ebe who announced member birthdays and club anniversaries. Notable was



Monte introduced our speaker, Dr. Matthew Gehrman, SW Regional Director of Academics for



Imagine Schools, who spoke on the subject "Pivoting During a Pandemic." He first started with the chronology of the issue, in that on March 5 Imagine Schools went on spring break which was extended to March 16, and then all schools were closed by the Governor to a planned March 27 opening, then to a second planned opening on April 10, then to indefinite closing.

Imagine School's planning was in all phases of the school system, including communications, safety, providing meals, technology (major challenges), remote learning systems, special education students and counseling services. Each of these



areas necessitated augmenting current systems and developing on-the-fly, new, special systems and techniques to accommodate the ever changing situation. Dr. Gehrman concluded by saying that he felt all those involved in the school; teachers, students and parents, grew during the period and created a blended path for learning. They are prepared to meet the additional challenges that will arise when school opens in the fall.

Monte then concluded this most unique and informative meeting, our 5,298th in Phoenix Rotary 100 club history.
