For Rotary Year 2014-2015

Final Summary

- In 2011-2012 we Rotarians throughout the district donated **\$281,269.90** to the Annual Programs Fund.
- So then, after three Years in 2014-2015, we had 1/2 that amount (\$140,634.45) in District Designated Funds (DDF) plus the unused DDF of \$69,927.84 from last year, totaling \$210,562.29
 - We invested \$46,997.11 of our Rotary Foundation donations directly on Missourians or in Missouri. (CAP Grants, Scholarship, GSE Team, RYLA) - Totaling \$82,722.00 of good.
 - We invested \$25,000 to the future of World Peace and funded Peace Scholars. Totaling \$25,000
 - We invested \$28,127.00 toward Polio eradication. Totaling \$28,127.00
 - We invested \$22,314.00 in international projects in Nepal and Uganda.
 - We invested another \$53,962.00 in 12 International projects in 8 countries for projects totaling \$1,168,096.00.
 - Through our funding of all these projects, both locally and overseas, the Rotarians of Missouri - District 6060 helped The Rotary Foundation to do:

Educational Programs –

- **Peace Fellow Program** – Donated \$25,000 to fund one of the 60 Rotary Foundation Peace Fellows.
- **Scholarship for Peace and Conflict Studies PhD** --Peace Fellow Alum Eduardo daCosta is attending the University of Manitoba, Canada. DaCosta has provided programs on his work in the Brazilian rainforest to many clubs in our district and at a district conference. Contribution: \$2,000
- **District Ambassadorial Scholarship** – Donated \$5,000 to fund Masters-level studies in Global Health at Washington University by Jeffrey Wilhite.
- **GSE Teams**--Hosted and sponsored inbound and outbound Group Study Exchange teams in partnership with RI District 9920, New Zealand. This was a single-theme GSE focused on immigrant and refugee services professionals. Total expenditure: \$14,632.11

Humanitarian Programs –

District Grant – we received \$26,915.69 to give out to our clubs as Community Assistance Program Grants (CAP Grants). We gave out 29 grants to 24 of our Rotary Clubs for use in local projects totaling \$62,500.85.

District Match of Donations to ShelterBox--we donated \$5,000 to ShelterBox for aid to Nepal after their devastating earthquake, as a match to club donations totaling \$10,050.

District International Grant-- we donated \$17,314.00 for a transformer to support the maize mill being installed in the village of Mbazzi, Uganda.

Global Grants – 9 grants were applied for and approved. We authorized the use of \$ 40,462.00 for these. Total project size was \$ 983,992.00
AND 3 grants projects are in the process of being applied for and under review which we expect to authorized the use of \$ 13,500.00 for an additional project size of \$ 184,104.00
