

Foundation Spending Summary For Rotary Year 2016-2017

Final Summary

- In 2013-2014 we Rotarians throughout the district donated **\$305,166** to the Annual Programs Fund.
- So then, after three Years, in 2016-2017, we had 1/2 that amount (\$152,583.00) in District Designated Funds (DDF) plus the unused DDF of \$68,735 from last year, and \$2,209 in EF-SHARE earnings, totaling \$223,527.
 - We invested \$54,299 of our Rotary Foundation donations directly on Missourians or in Missouri. (CAP Grants and Ambassadorial Scholarship) - Totaling \$95,379 of good.
 - We invested \$25,000 in the future of World Peace and funded Peace Scholars. Totaling \$25,000
 - We invested \$30,517.00 toward Polio eradication. Totaling \$30,517
 - We invested \$10,155 in club-sponsored international projects totaling \$23,436 of good
 - We invested another \$79,580 in 20 International projects in 15 countries for projects totaling \$1,752,375.
 - Through our funding of all these projects, both locally and overseas, the Rotarians of Missouri - District 6060 helped The Rotary Foundation to do:

Educational Programs –

- **Peace Fellow Program** – Donated \$25,000 to fund one of the 60 Rotary Foundation Peace Fellows.
- **Scholarship for Masters in Public Service** --Darlynton Adegar and Vinay Raj are attending the Clinton School of Public Service in Arkansas. Both scholars plan to use their degrees in work dedicated to poor families in their home countries. Cost: \$80,000 Contribution: \$2,000
- **Scholarship for Masters in Economic Development** - Aliya Diawara from Burkina Faso will be studying ways to improve the economic and political situations in her native region of Sub-Saharan Africa. Cost: \$80,000. Contribution: \$3,000
- **District Ambassadorial Scholarship** – St. Louis resident Will von Schrader is working towards his Masters Degree in International Development at the University of Manchester, England. He plans to use his education in a career helping establish policies and services for physically and mentally challenged refugees in camps throughout the world. \$25,000

Humanitarian Programs –

District Grant – we awarded \$29,299 to our clubs as Community Assistance Program Grants (CAP Grants). We gave out 35 grants to 24 of our Rotary Clubs for use in local projects totaling \$70,379.

District International Grants – we awarded \$10,155 as matching funds to 9 clubs for 6 international projects. Total project size was \$23,436
