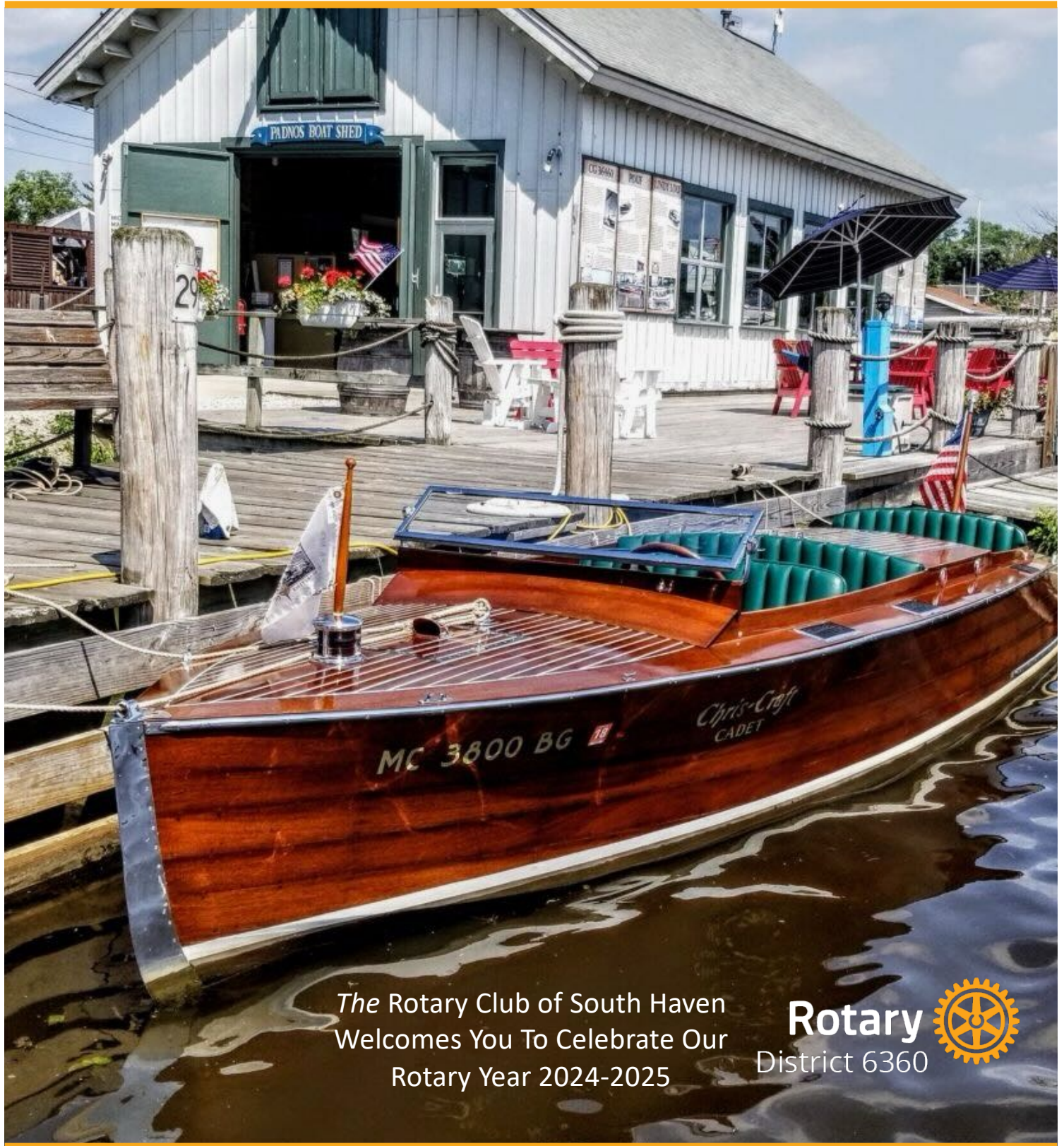

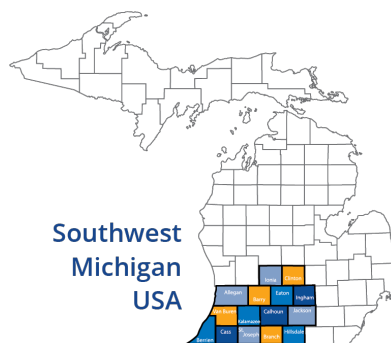

Chris Etienne is Associate Broker for Harbor Sotheby's International Realty and Director of Leasing for the Village at Bay Harbor. She has had a career in real estate since 2001 and has been in sales for more than 30 years, previously as Vice President of Treasury Management sales for National City Bank. She obtained her bachelor's degree from the University of Maryland European Division in Heidelberg, Germany, and her MBA from Lake Superior State University.

Chris serves on the board of trustees for North Central Michigan College as Vice Chair and on the North Central Michigan College Foundation board of directors. She also serves on the board of the Emmet Association of Realtors. Chris was appointed by Michigan Governor Rick Snyder in 2011 to serve on the Michigan Women's Commission and served as chair from 2016-2020. Chris received the Athena Award in 2007 and the Emmet Association of Realtors Realtor of the Year award in 2014.

Chris joined Rotary in 1990 and is honored to be a member of the Rotary Club of Petoskey, Michigan. She has served as club president, district governor, district membership chair, district Rotary Foundation chair, COL representative, district Peace Fellowships chair, zone training coordinator and zone institute chair. Chris has served Rotary International as training leader, president's representative, Rotary coordinator, Regional Rotary Foundation coordinator, and convention promotions committee member for Sao Paulo, Hamburg and Houston. She served as the moderator for the 2023 Regional Leader Global Learning Institutes and is currently serving on the board of WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) Rotary Action Group.

Chris is passionate about the work of The Rotary Foundation and has participated in National Immunization Days (NID) for polio eradication in India and Nigeria. She is a recipient of the Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service and the Rotary Foundation Distinguished Service Award. Chris and her husband, Dennis Lindeman, are Major Donors and members of the Bequest Society. She and Dennis are avid sailors and reside in Petoskey, Michigan with their two cats, Coal and Bentley.

Peter Annin

Author, Ashland, Wisconsin, USA

Director, Mary Griggs Burke Center for Freshwater Innovation, Northland College.



Peter Annin is a veteran conflict and environmental journalist who spent more than a decade reporting on a wide variety of issues for Newsweek.

For many years he specialized in coverage of domestic terrorism and other conflicts, including the bombing of the federal building in Oklahoma City and the Branch Davidian standoff outside Waco, Texas.

He has also written about the environment, including droughts, hurricanes, and wind power.

His first book, *The Great Lakes Water Wars*, has been called the definitive work on the Great Lakes water diversion controversy. It received the Great Lakes Book Award for nonfiction. He has since updated his book, and this revised edition was recognized with a Great Lakes Leadership Award in Communication Excellence from the Great Lakes Protection Fund.

Annin has served as associate director of the Institute for Journalism and Natural Resources, as well as managing director of the University of Notre Dame's Environmental Change Initiative.

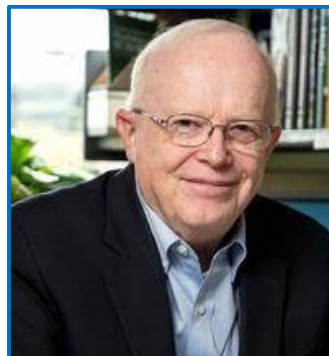
He currently serves as director of the Mary Griggs Burke Center for Freshwater Innovation at Northland College in Ashland, Wisconsin. He has a bachelor's degree in journalism from the University of Wisconsin and a master's in international affairs from Columbia University in New York.

David Myers, PH.d

Hope College, Michigan USA



Social psychologist Dr. David Myers is a communicator of psychological science to college students and the general public.

He has spent his entire teaching career at Hope College in Holland, Michigan. His award-winning research and writing have appeared in over three dozen scientific periodicals and numerous publications for the general public. He also has authored five general audience books, including *The Pursuit of Happiness and Intuition: Its Powers and Perils*.

His topic, “The Psychology of Misinformation and its Remedies”, documents 10 examples of misinformation people believe, and offers reasons for this behavior, together with solutions for improvement.

David has chaired Holland's Human Relations Commission, helped found an assistance center for families in poverty, and spoken to hundreds of college and community groups. Drawing on his experience, he also has written articles and a book *A Quiet World* about hearing loss.

He is a Seattle native and an all-weather bicyclist. David and his wife Carol are parents of three adult children, sons Peter (married to Danielle) and Andrew (married to Melinda), a daughter, Laura, and one grandchild, Allie. David and Carol also manage a family foundation, which receives David's royalties from his books.

Phoenix Mourning-Star, PH.d

Michigan USA



Dr. Phoenix Mourning-Star is a Rotary International Ambassadorial Scholar and a globally recognized expert in public health, education, and environmental science. With a PhD in Agricultural Ecology and Chemical/Biological Engineering from Colorado State University, and advanced degrees in law, biostatistics, and international affairs, Dr. Mourning-Star has served in diverse roles—from a STEM Education Analyst at the National Science Foundation to an Environmental Health Fellow at the EPA and researcher with the World Health Organization. A first-generation farm-kid from Southwest Michigan, who graduated from Colorado Mesa University without completing 10th grade, Mourning-Star brings a deep commitment to education, sustainability, and community engagement, shaped by growing up on a small family farm in rural Colorado.

Currently a Presidential Management Fellow with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Dr. Mourning-Star also leads rural education initiatives in Michigan, including efforts to expand agricultural technology programs and cybersecurity support for K-12 schools. A lifelong advocate for community-driven solutions, Mourning-Star is a passionate voice for underserved populations, bringing decades of interdisciplinary leadership in science, equity, and policy. His work has been honored by the U.S. State Department, Marine Corps, and global climate and health organizations.

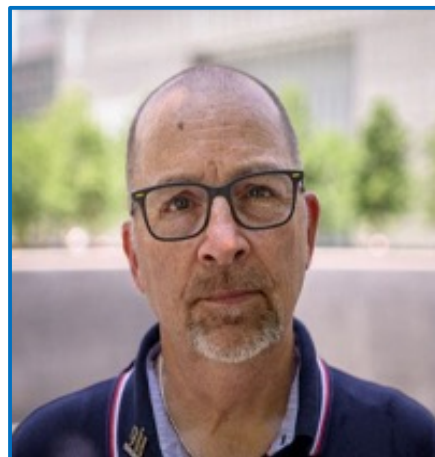

Joe Dittmar

Lewes Delaware, USA | Always Remember

Joe Dittmar is a **9/11** survivor who was in the 105th floor of the South Tower of the World Trade Center when the terrorist attacks occurred on September 11, 2001. He was attending a business meeting on the 105th floor, the highest occupied space, when the first plane hit the North Tower, and he witnessed the horrifying aftermath as he was trying to flee the scene. Despite the chaos and danger, Joe managed to escape the building by descending the stairs.

His story is one of incredible bravery and survival, as he navigated through the smoke, flames, and collapsing debris to make it out alive. Joe's harrowing experience and his journey back home to his family have been widely shared and serve as a testament to human resilience and courage. Joe is the featured speaker for the Rotary Club Hero Recognition event on the final night of the conference.
