



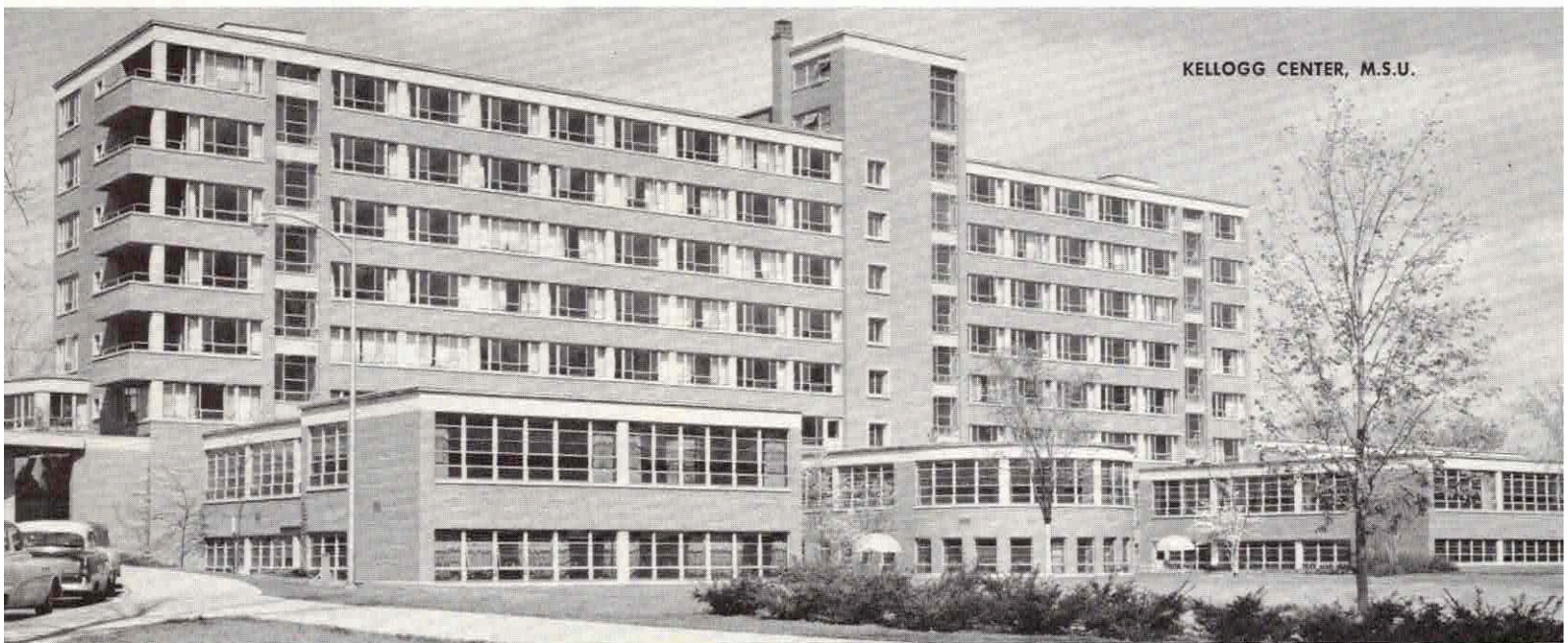

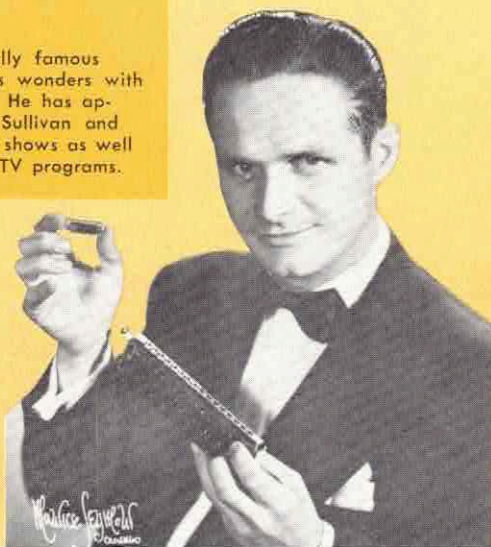
BOB BERUBE TRIO.

GINNY SIBERT AND HER PLAYMATES.

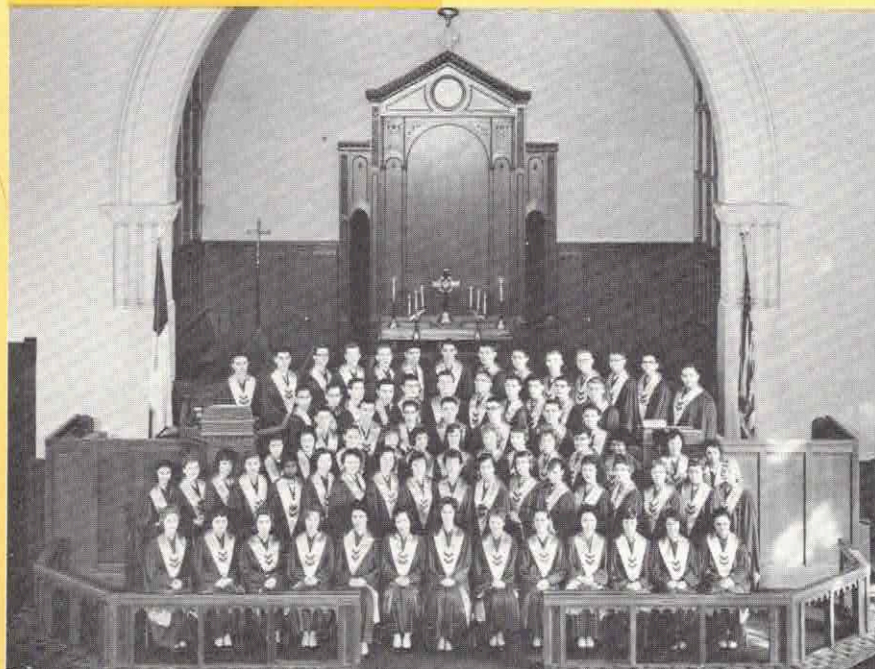
A versatile group of four entertainers featuring music with a danceable beat. This foursome presents tunes both popular and nostalgic — each member contributing instrumentally and vocally.
