


# Benton Harbor Sunrise Brian Saxton - "Man With a Plan"

Sergeant Hurley and Matt appeared on a featured story on the CBS Evening News. Matt effectuated amendments by Congress to the Servicemembers' Civil Relief Act (SCRA). He has since written a book called A Soldier's Home and started a foundation to educate judges and the public about the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act that provides critical consumer and other protections to our military personnel and their families. As we've followed Matt's work for this cause, he has brought a heightened awareness and appreciation of service members, veterans and their service to our club.

Matt's name should be listed in the dictionary after the word "hero" and that is what he is to our club. Thanks Matt.
