Members determined the centennial to be the perfect occasion for pursuit of a long desired project—a welcome wall, memorial walkway, and garden. Larry Crandall agreed to accept the role of project coordinator. Larry worked closely with supportive city officials and architects. They selected an ideal site, a vacant piece of property at a major intersection ushering people into the city. Larry launched a successful fundraising effort selling recognition pavers to be incorporated in the design. He also provided data and information that enabled the Club's grant writers to submit successful proposals to District 6360 and RI.

Larry's leadership built momentum, architectural renderings received applause, financing fell into place. In the midst of the optimism and excitement, however, planners encountered an unexpected roadblock. They discovered that the Michigan Department of Transportation owned the property! Undaunted, Larry began working through the bureaucracy to facilitate a transfer of ownership. He wrote letters, made phone calls, and attended meetings. He responded promptly to every communication, answered every question, and provided requested documentation. Nonetheless, progress proved slow. When the pandemic shuttered state government in March of 2020, progress came to a halt. Larry kept donors and the community apprised and never lost faith that the matter would, eventually, be resolved. Indeed, nearly three years later, the city assumed ownership. Construction began in July of 2021 and concluded in November. Thanks to Larry's positivity and perseverance, a beautiful garden, a memorial walkway, and the Rotary logo atop a stately brick wall welcome people to Dowagiac.




Lansing-Dewitt Sunrise


