Where do grant funds come from?	Funded by contributions from Rotarians in District to TRF's Annual Fund three years ago	Funded by TRF's World Fund, and by contribution from Rotarians in District to TRF's Annual Fund three years ago
How are the funds allocated?	50% of donations made by Rotarians in District to TRF's Annual Fund three years ago is returned to the District as District Designated Funds (DDF) Up to 50% can be used for District grants	The balance of District Designated Funds (at least 50%) is available to match funds from clubs
Are these grants matching?	Yes Club must match grant amount	Yes. World Fund will match money from District Designated Funds at 100%

Grant description	Funds local community activities and projects: Priorities given to projects that benefit the community most meaningfully, benefit the greatest number of people, and to those groups with the greatest degree of need (Generally will not consider consecutive or multi-year funding requests)	Some Rotary Clubs have their own Foundations which are not connected at all with The Rotary Foundation or with the District 6360 Foundation
Project focus	Community service projects	At the discretion of the Club Foundation
Where do grant funds come from?	Funded by the proceeds from raffle tickets sold by the D6360F each year	Different for each Club Foundation
How are the funds allocated?	Decision on how much funding is available is made by the Board of Trustees of the D6360F, based on income from the year's raffle ticket sales	At the discretion of the Club Foundation
Are these grants matching?	Yes Club must match grant amount
