Heather shared that for 4B years Learning Tree Farms has offered hands on educational opportunities to youth at its 85-acre farm. The Rotary grant will support its preschool fieldtrips. President Brian Martin came back to the virtual podium to introduce Alan Pippenger as Chair of the Day. Alan introduced our speaker ❖ Rob Signom III, Curator of America ❖s Packard Museum. While sharing pictures and stories of many Packard vehicles that are house at the Museum, Rob shared the following details about America ❖s Packard Museum:

- Packard were manufactured until 1956 and then became part of Studebaker/Packard until
- 1958.

 The Museum was founded in 1991 and opened its doors in 1992. They look forward to celebrating 30 years of operations in 2022.

 The Museum is housed in the original building occupied by The Citizens ♠ Motorcar Company. The building was built in 1917. This Museum offer a working car facility which transports attendees back to the 1920 ♠s with the facility. The Museum includes a working service bay and the Packards in its fleet. The Museum can display 50 vehicles while the entire collection includes 75 vehicles. This represents the nation ♠s largest collection of Packards available to the public. The Museum includes a library for research.

 The Museum has stonework and the doorway signs from the Packard manufacturing plant in Detroit. In the future the Museum will incorporate these items into the display.

- As a result of the pandemic, the Museum was closed and recently re-opened. The Museum is open to the public Thursday to Sunday from noon to 5PM. Generally, admission is \$8 with many discounts for students, seniors, etc.

 The Museum◆s income is generated by admission fees, support from donors, rentals of space and vehicles, an annual gala, and donated cars of all makes and models.

 Packard vehicles were high end vehicles, and the vehicles tell the story of American history. For instance, the 1903 Model K was the first vehicle to travel at 60 miles per hour. During wartime Packard built 1000♦s of army vehicles with a top speed of 17 miles per hour.
- Current projects at the Museum include revitalizing the building and grounds. Donors are welcomed. Additionally, the Museum is seeking opportunities to connect with more Dayton businesses and not-for-profit organizations as part of its strategic vision.

President Brian wrapped up the meeting at 1:00 PM by thanking Rob for his presentation. Brian reminded Rotarians that the next meeting provides the opportunity to meet again in person. The meeting speaker on June 14 will be Pam Plageman who will share about the future of the Dayton Convention Center.
