President Brian then congratulated Fran Rickenbach for being this year's Dayton Rotary Outstanding Club Member she will be honored at President's Club Award Breakfast on August 12th at 7AM the Presidential Banquet Center. She is being recognized for all her efforts with leading the ZOOM meetings.

Walt Hibner, filling in for Phil Parker, then introduced Rick Thie as our newest Rotarian. Rick is the President of the Kettering Medical Center Foundation. Welcome to Rotary Rick! President Brian then reviewed his year as President starting with the Passing of the Gavel that took place at Court House Square last June with Jean Maychack masks and all. The Pandemic definitely affected his year as President - little did we know that at the start of meeting via ZOOM we would not come back together in person for 15 months. Thanks to Frank Scott for helping us transition to DACdb from Clubrunner software during his year it seems to have been a good move and more efficient tool. We started the \$120 a quarter flat rate for dues effort during Brian's term as we were not collecting lunch revenue but still had fixed expenses that needed to be covered.

We had no idea that we would also be looking for a new Rotary office location but when Sinclair purchased our office building we began the search for a new location which we will be moving to in September. Thanks to all who gave recommendations unfortunately 90% of them didn't meet our budget. Thanks to Rick Schwartz and WinSupply for offering the club a space in his facility matching our current rental rate.

Brian thanked John Lyman for the awesome programming this year and Jim Gallagher for his help on this effort as well. Thanks to Fran for helping with ZOOM and leading the char rooms for the social aspect we were missing while meeting virtually.

We kept Projects going in spite of the Pandemic we collected funds to supply masks to DPS teachers and students. The Peace Committee working with Miami Valley Meals helped distributed food during the Holidays. Frank Scott, Fred Abrams and Diane Welborn along with the International Committee have been working on developing the Ecuador Project for which we just received approval for a Global Grant from Rotary International. The project will provide clean water and sanitation to those in the community they are working in.

Brian thanked Sarah Hippensteel Hall for quietly moving in the background to write up the District Grants requesting funds and the follow up reports for our various District Projects. Thanks also to Holly Wiggins and the Foundation for continuing to distribute grants to worthwhile organizations throughout the year.

Brian then presented appreciation gifts to the board and officers. He then pinned the President's pin on Shaun Yu and handed over the gavel. Shaun asked the incoming officers and board to stand. He pinned Brian with the Past President's pin and presented him his Certificate of Recognition and a gift from the club of 2 bottles of Vodka, 2 dozen golf balls and a gift certificate to Yankee Trace.

Shaun then commented ♦Put up your feet for a moment♦you just gave a radio guy a microphone!♦ He commented that Presidents before him commented that in spite of anything you can't mess up so bad in your year that the club won't go on.

Shaun told us his background of how he was born in Seoul Korea and at the age of 6 years old he moved with his family to Anchorage Alaska. They became Naturalized Citizens in 1982. His parents started a laundry mat that they ran as a family business. Shaun and his siblings were the first to go to college where he met his wife Jennifer and hit the lottery with her and their 2 kids. The Radio buisness has been kind to him and he is doing what he loves. He thanked Georgie Woessner for bringing him to Dayton to take over Dayton Public Radio.

It all starts with service - Service Above Self. He asked ♦when was the last time you participated in a service project with other Dayton Rotarians? If it takes you more than a moment to think, that♦s the problem. I want to have members getting together for social activities and service projects and getting to know each other more than just on Mondays at lunch.♦ We will be planting trees in September as part of a District Project to replace trees destroyed by the Memorial Day Tornados. Please consider taking part in this project.

His focus is Every One, Bring One we as individuals need to remember that our membership doesn't grow without everyone's participation. Please bring a prospective member to lunch. He wants to hear more from members, with ideas for speakers and programs and ways more members can get involved and interact with each other.

Rotary started as a Rotation from members offices so don't be surprised if you see a lot of programs from within our membership whether about their company or a interesting hobby. He also promised several Club assemblies during the year as a way to get feedback from members.

He asked that you consider supporting Rotary International as only 38 of our club members made a gift to RI last year. He expects each Rotarian to give to RI something♦doesn't have to be big. But, while we continue to serve the local, Dayton community, we need to remember we are part of an international organization.

He acknowledged presidents before him and promised an exciting year ahead.

Rick came to KMCF after several years at Johns Hopkins All Children's Foundation in St. Petersburg, FL, where he served as a Senior Gift Officer and as Assistant Director of Planned Giving. His responsibilities included building and maintaining good working relationships with estate planning professionals, as well as cultivating, soliciting and stewarding a portfolio of current and prospective donors to fulfill the goals of the foundation. Rick holds a Master's in Philanthropic Studies from the preeminent Indiana University Lilly Family School of Philanthropy in Indianapolis, Indiana. First established as the Center on Philanthropy in 1987, the Lilly School is the first of its kind in the nation.

Rick is a member of the Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP), the Association for Healthcare Philanthropy (AHP), and the National Association of Charitable Gift Planners (NACGP)/ His Community Service has included several leadership positions, including as founder and president of the Jane H. Thie Memorial Fund, a non-profit corporation dedicated to raising funds to advance the research efforts in cancer of the pancreas to bring a cure to those suffering from pancreatic cancer. Rick has earned several professional certifications: Chartered Advisor in Philanthropy, Chartered Financial Consultant, Chartered Life Underwriter, and Certified Wealth Strategist.

While living in Florida, Rick was member of the Sarasota Seventh-Day Adventist Church where he served as a Leadership Team Member and Elder. Rick is a former Rotarian from the Rotary Club of Lapeer (MI) and the Rotary Club of Sarasota Keys (FL) where he served as President during his time there.


