Cheri Hottinger introduced Russ White. Russ White is the director of Real Estate for Aldi, Springfield, Oh division. White provided some details on his role at Aldi, the organizations philosophy, background and plans for Licking County. After the initial introduction, white played a brief video about Aldi including Aldi's philosophy regarding cost reduction, maximizing efficiencies, reduction of environmental impact and to be a great employer to their employees.

Aldi is a German company with locations in different countries. It wasn't until 1976 that Aldi came to the United States. The growth didn't happen immediately, as it wasn't until 1998 that the organization reached 500 stores. Since then the organization has grown quickly and has consistently delivered a simple, consistent layout to their stores with a modest size that features open ceilings, CO2 refrigeration and other technological advancements that helped to reduce their carbon footprint. The organization also uses all LED lighting. Aldi's leadership team prefers to spend more initially so as to do the right thing and to reduce maintenance cost in the long-run, explains White.

Aldi has more than 1,600 stores in 35 states in the U.S. The cost effective approach employed by the organization helps to save shoppers up to 50% on their weekly must-have items and can have a significant impact on the more than 40 million customers that shop at Aldi monthly.

Aldi also seeks to be the employer of choice for employees by offering an attractive benefits program. Based on this approach, White explained that it is not uncommon to see employees with long tenures at Aldi. White also discussed Aldi's involvement in Licking County through the stores in Newark and Heath. The organization has also donated to the local Food Pantry.

In closing, White underscored a list of strengths of the organization along with some decision criteria that are used to enter new markets. Some of the differentiator of Aldi includes: Aldi exclusive brands, Aldi Finds, Aldi Test Kitchens, Aldi Twice as Nice Guarantee.

Questions:

- Do you participate in United Way campaigns? Answer: The Corporate office donates by giving each division an amount to donate in their area. Nationally and internationally they have foundations to which they donate.
- Within the blind taste-test how do you determine the parameters for each item? Answer: The organization uses different parameters for each item and employs a rating system that is matched against the national brands.
- Why use CO2 over R22 with the refrigeration? Answer: R22 is outdated and CO2 is a lot better for the environment.
- What are produce quality standards? Answer: The organization takes the produce to a cutting room to check them and a selector then cuts the produce to make veggie trays and food trays. Then they get taste-tested. If the produce aren't at their required standards then they get refused.
