Dr. Rajjoub – Cardiologist at LMH

Hassan Rajjoub, M.D., Interventional Cardiologist at the Licking Memorial Heart Center, received his Doctor of Medicine Degree at Tichreen University School of Medicine in Lattakia, Syria. He completed a residency in internal medicine at the University of Chicago Weiss Hospital and completed a cardiology fellowship and interventional cardiology fellowship at Saint Louis University Hospital in St. Louis, Missouri. He also is fellowship trained in peripheral vascular disease intervention and board certified in cardiovascular disease, interventional cardiology and nuclear cardiology. In 2013, he received the Licking Memorial Health Systems' (LMHS) MVP Award for his consistent demonstration of LMHS values. Under Dr. Rajjoub's leadership, the Cardiac Cath Lab team was recognized with the prestigious LMHS President's Award in 2015. Dr. Rajjoub received Honorable Mention recognition for the 2015 Health Care Hero Provider awards, presented by Columbus Business First. In addition, the Cardiology Department received the National Cardiovascular Data Registry Platinum Performance Achievement Award and the American Heart Association Mission: Lifeline Gold Level Recognition from 2015 to 2017. Dr. Rajjoub was recognized as 2016 Practitioner of the Year by Columbus CEO Magazine for providing outstanding care and advancing the practice of medicine. He is married and has three children.

PROGRAM

Cheri Hottinger introduced **Verdie Abel** the Education Coordinator of the Licking County Recycling Department.

The Licking County Recycling Department is a government agency charged with promotion, education and encouragement of recycling. They provide 126 recycling bins at 26 locations in the county. In 2017 they collected seven million pounds of material. Each person in Licking County creates 4 ½ lbs of waste a day. In the U.S. there is one billion pounds of waste per day.

We have 2,000 landfills in the United States, sealed with waste that does not decompose. If every of the 175,000 Licking Countians recycled one extra item a day, it would equate to nine million more recycled items per year.

Verdie outlined five reasons to recycle:

- Saves energy
- Conserves natural resources
- Reduces pollution
- Creates jobs
- Saves landfill space

And what we recycle:

- Paper, newspapers, boxes
- Glass bottles, food jars
- Aluminum Cans
- Steel or Tin Cans (food cans)
- Plastic bottles, jugs and food containers



In closing **Verdie** shared how the LC Recycling program can assist businesses with waste audits and educational programs; and he shared ways to recycle electronics – Goodwill if they are operational, The Works if they are ready to take apart, motor oil – local garages, and yard and kitchen scraps by composting.
