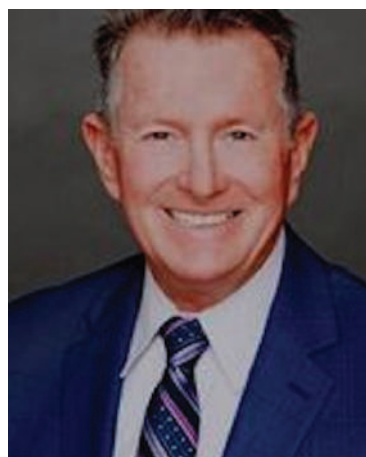

Karl Koon, Director of Recruitment - Team Buckeye, Pelotonia

Karl Koon is a Development Officer for The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center - James Cancer Hospital and Solove Research Institute and the Director of Rider Recruitment for Team Buckeye, the official peloton (team) representing Ohio State in Pelotonia. Team Buckeye members include students, faculty, staff and alumni of Ohio State who wish to represent Buckeye nation in Pelotonia, including a very successful team from the OSU - Newark campus. Team Buckeye - Rolling for A Cure.

Created in 2008, Pelotonia is a three-day experience that includes a weekend of cycling, entertainment and volunteerism. Thanks to its generous funding partners, Pelotonia is able to direct 100 percent of every rider-raised dollar to cancer research at Ohio State. To date, Pelotonia has raised more than \$184M.

Karl has ridden in Pelotonia every year and started his position at Ohio State in 2011. Karl has learned to embrace spandex and cycling helmets as part of his official work wardrobe and is an avid cyclist as Ohio weather conditions permit. His career through-line includes philanthropy and non-profit work benefiting organizations focused on domestic violence, women's and children's initiatives and substance abuse education and prevention.

PROGRAM

**Dan Delawder** introduced Kenny McDonald of Columbus 2020 who opened with a statement of gratitude and acknowledged the people in the room as those that help make a community special.

Next, Mr. McDonald presented a background of 2020 noting that it was inspired by the recession of 2008 when unemployment was over 16% in the area. Leaders in the Central Ohio area gathered for 15 months to devise a plan to explore the possibilities for the future and create a thriving, economically sound eleven county region.

The Central Ohio (CO) Region produces 137 billion products and services annually. 43,000 people moved into CO last year or 115 per day. We must build capacity to keep up. Core activities include retaining and expanding existing companies, attracting new employers, accelerating high-growth enterprises and improving the region's overall competitiveness. 100% of the population growth in Ohio comes from CO.

Central Ohio is one of the largest centers of computer power in the world. This is a huge advantage for CO. It is important to grow dynamically, become more diverse, innovative and prosperous. He stressed the importance of supporting entrepreneurs and noted Licking County and contiguous counties such as Mt. Vernon as places people want to live.

We must prep for the future. "We will see as much change in the next 5 years as we have seen in the last 40."
