Announcements:

- **John Paul Munhall** – Update on Free Enterprise Academy. This is the program's 45th year. Location will be CTEC. The committee has been working on many updates to the program with many changes that occurred last year—streamlining the program, increasing student participation and adding sponsors to supplement the scholarship dollars. John Carlson introduced Dr. C Weldon Matthews who shared an overview of Amateur Radio or "Ham" radio. Amateur radio enthusiasts can be involved in a wide range of activities and levels. There are three license levels – technician, general and extra. Each level requires study and testing. The FCC controls the radio frequencies.

The American Radio Relay League is the primary resource of ham radio information. Ham radio operators are of various ages. They use many kinds of equipment including voice, Morse Code, computers, tv cameras, radio satellites, the space station and even the moon to bounce from. Ham radio does not use the internet.

Radio operators use the systems to communicate personally with friends and family, to support community activities like races and parades. Operators help with public safety in cooperation with the National Weather, Skywarn and National Hurricane Center.

Operators often conduct contests, like collecting by communicating with locations around the globe in 300 other countries. Ham radio operators will travel to remote locations to set up operations to help other operators contact those countries.

Weldon described the typical equipment; transmitter, receiver, radio, base station and "Go Box" many of the operators use the repeater on Horn's Hill.

Weldon invited members to join the Field Day on Horn's Hill, June 22 and 23, with Saturday afternoon as the best time to interact with operators and get on the radio. Additionally weather spotter training is April 15, 6 pm at Newark High School.
