## SERVICE PROJECT

## PROGRAM

Newark Rotarians convened off site for the week's luncheon gathering. An annual tradition of Easter Week service was hosted at First United Methodist Church in Newark. Some members confessed going to other places first, including St. Paul's where past such services were held, regular venue Moundbuilders, and, even, one person to Second Presbyterian. A strong gathering was assembled nonetheless.

At Noon, following an organ rendition of Carmen Ohio in the church sanctuary, Pastor Scott Campbell acknowledged the Rotarians and the marking of the occasion of Holy Week. He, then, recited a prayer, including a blessing for "ears to listen."

Wes Humble began his remarks in the spirit of the service. "Jesus believed in Service Above Self," he said kicking off a theme of Rotary mottoes. He referenced 1950 Rotary International's adoption of motto "He profits most who serves best" and the 1989 adoption as the principal motto "Service Above Self."

Humble equated Jesus' washing of feet as an example of Service Above Self and referenced Luke Chapter 10 regarding the question posed, "And who is my neighbor?"

He continued his remarks around four themes:  
 Showing mercy, like the Samaritan in Jesus' parable.  
 Possessing a servant attitude  
 Taking selfless actions  
 Exhibiting sacrificial affection

Wes wrapped up with three stories around those four themes.



## Service Above Self

He shared the story of the town of Gander, Newfoundland which was where displaced planes and their passengers were stranded after planes were grounded on 9/11 as a modern act of service above self. He shared his personal story about a Good Samaritan acting not out of religious belief. Lastly, he cited a story about Newark Rotary President **Jack Stickle** for stepping up in the same theme above Service Above Self.

He concluded with a challenge to Rotarians to continue to put Service Above Self. Six tables of Rotarians attended dinner in the church basement where President Jack thanked our hosts and encouraged participation at next week's meeting where the Newark Catholic Robotics Club was expected to be the program.

## ROTARY HISTORY: Two Official Mottos

Service Above Self and One Profits Most Who Serves Best, Rotary's official mottoes, can be traced back to the early days of the organization.

In 1911, the second Rotary convention, in Portland, Oregon, USA, approved He Profits Most Who Serves Best as the Rotary motto. The wording was adapted from a speech that Rotarian Arthur Frederick Sheldon delivered to the first convention, held in Chicago the previous year. Sheldon declared that "only the science of right conduct toward others pays. Business is the science of human services. He profits most who serves his fellows best."

The Portland gathering also inspired the motto Service Above Self. During an outing on the Columbia River, Ben Collins, president of the Rotary Club of Minneapolis, Minnesota, USA, talked with Seattle Rotarian J.E. Pinkham about the proper way to organize a Rotary club, offering the principle his club had adopted: Service, Not Self. Pinkham invited Rotary founder Paul Harris, who also was on the trip, to join their conversation. Harris asked Collins to address the convention, and the phrase Service, Not Self was met with great enthusiasm.

At the 1950 Rotary International Convention in Detroit, Michigan, USA, two slogans were formally approved as the official mottoes of Rotary: He Profits Most Who Serves Best and Service Above Self. The 1989 Council on Legislation established Service Above Self as the principal motto of Rotary because it best conveys the philosophy of unselfish volunteer service. He Profits Most Who Serves Best was modified to They Profit Most Who Serve Best in 2004 and to its current wording, One Profits Most Who Serves Best, in 2010.
